Diary of Andrew J. Zercher 1893 Transcribed by Fred Schenck June 2021

Sunday, January 1

At Sunday school & preaching by Rev. Noacher. Text: Matthew 19:23, a.m. At home. Rev. Noacher took supper with us, p.m. At church in eve. Text: Matthew 10 + 32.33. Much warmer. Snow going. Raining partly all day. Ther: 52. Cloudy.

Monday, January 2

Taking down tobacco & brought some up in cellar. Had horse hitched for the first today. Like him right well, a.m. Got word of the death of Mrs. Martin Miller (widow). Funeral on Thursday at 9 at house of Henry Good & 10 at Byerland Church. Working at coffin p.m. Got letter of Hon J. N. L. Looks bright. Ther: 36. Partly clear. Colder.

Tuesday, January 3

In shop till 9 a.m. Went to Lancaster. Bought merino for lining coffin & clothes for self. John Zercher paid me for Esther Zercher's coffin: \$25.00. Jacob Kreider paid me \$5.00 for Mart Good for coal money. On horse. Returned home at 3 p.m. Made rough box, etc., p.m. Cold & stormy all day. Ther: 22. Partly clear.

Wednesday, January 4

Working in shop at coffin. Geo took rough box over to Byerland Meeting House, a.m. In shop, etc., p.m. Tonight's papers have it that I am appointed to a position at Harrisburg as pastor & fielder in the Senate through my friend Hon. John H. Landis. This is certainly an agreeable surprise as I hardly thought he would get it accomplished. Cold. Snow in eve. Cloudy. Ther: 20.

Thursday, January 5

Attended funeral of Maria Miller, aged 86-6-

27. Rev. John Harnish preached. St. Luke 10-42. Rev. Abrm Herr: Revelations 14-13. Rec'd \$25.00 cash for coffin & attendance. Bought 1 1/2 bus wheat up from below to exchange for flour at Henry Martin's. Auditing the accounts of treasurer. Balance in my hand, \$3.95, which I will pay over to my successor for Henry Martin at business next meeting. Cold. Snowing in eve. Ther: 18. Cloudy.

Friday, January 6

Working about home all day. Chas Trissler paid \$25.00 on note given me for market wagon. Got a letter from Hon John H. Landis stating that my appointment was confirmed. Cold & stormy. Ther: 18. Partly clear.

Saturday, January 7

About home all day. At P. M. Bruner's for supper. Mary gave it in honor of her birthday (23 years). Cold.

Sunday, January 8

At Sunday school & prayer meeting a.m. Went over to see Grandmother p.m. At home in eve. Benj F Smith's child buried today at M. E. Church. Wife at funeral. Cold all day. Ther: 22. Partly cloudy.

Monday, January 9

At Lancaster. Saw Hon. J. H. L. with regard to Harrisburg. I need not go till I get word from him. Sold my lower place (Musser) to J. R. Yentzer for \$1300. To have posts, straw, rails, etc., except one 1 horse, load of straw, pile of rails at north of barn & old chestnut tree. Noah Wade, 9 ft wall at 35 cents. Snow part of a.m. & all of p.m. Ther: 19. Cloudy.

Tuesday, January 10

Stripping tobacco all day. Very stormy. The snow is drifting badly & very cold. Very cold & getting colder. Ther: 12. Cloudy.

Wednesday, January 11

Stripping tobacco all day. Very cold. Brought

down 19 chicks this eve. Have 3 hens coming out. Sold the chicks to H. C. McAllister at 5 cents each. Men opened the road from Bortzfield's store toward Tanyard (Myers) this p.m. which had drifted shut yesterday. Very cold all day. Ther: 4. Clear.

Thursday, January 12

In shop & fixed saw for Martin Agon: 15 cents cash. Sold 25 chicks right from nest to H. C. McAllister at 5 cents each. Total: \$1.25. About 8 inches of snow fell today. Settled with Fred Flinchbach. Paid him \$1.12 balance due to date. Snowing partly all day. Ther: 14. Cloudy.

Friday, January 13

About home all day. H. C. McAllister paid me \$5.60 in full to date. Balance on account due. Wm Caldwell got 1 bus potatoes: 75 cents. Very cold all day. Ther: 4. Clear.

Saturday, January 14

Went to Safe Harbor to see about walnut lumber at G. A. Taylor's mill & offered \$15.00 for 1000, a.m. Sold cow to B. N. Montgomery for \$21.00 & helped him down with her, p.m. At Missionary anniversary in eve. Rev. Callendar of Mechanicsburg here to speak. Very cold all day. Ther: 2. Clear.

Sunday, January 15

At Sunday school. Rev. Callendar spoke on Japan, he being secy. of the former board of Missions of our church instead of preaching, a.m. At home. Rev. Noacher, M. L. Bruner & Mrs. Maynard here p.m. At church in eve. Text: Isaiah 33-20. Stormy & cold. Ther: 14. Clear.

Monday, January 16

Took children to school, up at Bruner's store, etc., a.m. Took horse over to Uncle C. B. Miller's. He offered to take him in the feed till I need him. Spent the rest of the p.m. with

Grandmother & Miller's. At home in eve.. This was the coldest day we had for a number of years. Ther: 4 below. Clear.

Tuesday, January 17

Working in shop, etc., partly all day. Got word to come to Harrisburg tomorrow morning. J. R. Yentzer got 38 ft boards & paid for same. Martin Eckman & family were found in a sad way (of poverty) in Lancaster & taken to the Poor House. Cold. Ther: 8. Cloudy.

Wednesday, January 18

Went to Harrisburg this morning. Got there at noon. Went direct to the capital. Heard the vote read for U.S. Senator resulting in the election of M. S. Quay Rep. went from there to Senate Chamber with Senator John M. Landis & was given in charge of the Sargent in Arms, who had me take the oath for my appointment. Made some arrangements with regard to employing someone to do my work in my absence. Took dinner at Hershey House & returned to Lancaster in eve.. Very cold. The coldest day. Ther: 5 below. Clear.

Thursday, January 19

Stayed at Geo Hasting's last night as I did not get to Lancaster in time to get home. Was up to see Winters this morning & at court room, etc., etc. Came home with Kreider's stage this eve. Mr. Weimer, agent for W. R. F. Weimer & Co. here this eve. I paid him \$20.66 bill to date. I heard from a party at Harrisburg that the ice at Minneapolis is 6 ft 2 in thick. Ther: 10. Clear.

Friday, January 20

Working about home a.m. Went over to Miller's & Grandmother. Rachel Hess paid me for the cow sold to B. H. Montgomery, \$21.50, p.m. Paid Lizzie Miller \$1.75 for coffin lining got for Moses Hess. Stormy & cold. Ther: 10. Clear.

Saturday, January 21

Working about home. Noah Wade got 9 ft walnut & 5 cents: 45 cents, & paid \$1.00 on account, a.m. At township primary, p.m. The following were nominated. Judge: Jos Walter (267). Inspector: Michael Kneisley (176). Tax Coll: M. Benedict (161). Supervisors: Geo Garrett (183), Isaac Shenk (103). School Director: Fred Shoff (132), E. H. Zercher (144). Constable (265). Auditor: Andrew Good (266). Town Clerk: Theo Jones (263). Total vote polled: 269. Cold but snow melting some. Ther: 10. Clear.

Sunday, January 22

At Sunday school prayer meeting a.m. At home. Dr. Witmer here, p.m. Cold & damp. Ther: 4. Cloudy.

Monday, January 23

At Lancaster today. Paid S. A. Gibbs \$25.00 balance due on furniture to date. Gave P. M. Bruner check for \$80.00 for short time. Got \$7.88 for juror fee for going to Adamstown about 5 years ago. Bought 1 doz. K &/F for wife: \$1.50. Loaned O. F. Bruner \$2.00. Snow melting some. Sleighing about played out. Ther: 20. Clear.

Tuesday, January 24

Stripping tobacco a.m. Working in shop, etc., p.m. Like spring. Snow melting. Ther: 20. Clear.

Wednesday, January 25

Working about home all day. Sold my Cornett to Ed Urban. (\$5.00). Took \$2.00 worth of coffin lining & received \$1.75 in cash. Balance \$1.25 to be paid soon. Filed saw for M. H. Groff: 15 cents. Paid Wm C. Henry \$150 bill to date. I have a very bad cold. Like spring. Snow is melting very fast. Ther: 22. Partly clear.

Thursday, January 26

Working in shop a.m. Went ducking p.m. Did

not get any. Like spring. Snow melting. Ther: 24. Partly clear.

Friday, January 27

Working in shop partly all day. James G. Blaine died today at 11 a.m. at Washington, D.C. Very much like spring. Ther: 35. Cloudy.

Saturday, January 28

About home a.m. Went over to Marticville to Sale of Dr. Christ's personal property. Things brought fair prices. Sent check to F. M. Buck for \$92.00 balance on horse bought from Shell & Good. At IORM in eve. Very damp & unpleasant. Ther: 30. Cloudy.

Sunday, January 29

At Sunday school & preaching. Text: St. Luke 2-40. Roads very sloppy. Rain part of a.m. At home. H. C. McAllister here. Wife went up to see Lizzie Gardner, who has a young son, p.m. At church in eve. Text: Ephesians 4-30. Mr. Deacon & wife we're there. Had an introduction to her. He announced that Rev. Fred Brady would preach at M. E. Church tomorrow eve. Rain a.m. Cloudy & damp p.m. Ther: 38. Cloudy.

Monday, January 30

Went to Lancaster to go to Harrisburg but met Mr. Landis & he has everything arranged so that I do not need to go up for this time. At M. E. Church in eve. Rev. Fred Brady preached. James G. Blaine buried today at Oak Hill Cemetery (Georgetown). Colder. Ther: 30. Cloudy.

Tuesday, January 31

Stripping tobacco partly all day. Wife out at Wm Caldwell's p.m. Rev. Deacon & Brady called to see me, p.m. Spring like. Ther: 32. Partly cloudy.

Wednesday, February 1

In shop, etc., a.m. Stripping tobacco, etc., p.m. Damp & rain in eve. Ther: 33. Cloudy.

Thursday, February 2

Took down balance of tobacco & working about home a.m. Went out to M. M. Bortzfield's store to see fox chase. Never saw any before. Had certainly an exciting time. There were about 200 men, women, & children present. They gave the Fox 20 minutes start & was caught in John Graver's farm by Harry Herr of Marticville. Ground Hog Day today. No sun. I suppose we will have fine weather. Very damp all day. Ther: 38. Cloudy.

Friday, February 3

Working about home a.m. H. C. McAllister went to Safe Harbor for lumber (walnut) that I bought of Mr. Binkley of Manor. 680 ft at \$18.00 per 1000. \$12.25. H. G. McAllister charged \$1.00 per load for hauling. Rain & very damp a.m. Stormy & cold p.m. Ther: 33. Partly cloudy.

Saturday, February 4

Piling lumber & went to Safe Harbor for balance of walnut. H. C. McAllister hauled same. Charged \$1.00 for hauling 2 loads, a.m. Piled lumber, etc., p.m. At IORM in eve. Stormy & cold. Ther: 20. Cloudy.

Sunday, February 5

At Sunday school & prayer meeting a.m. At M. E. Church in eve. Rev. Mr. Deacon preached from 85th Psalm, verse 6. Cold & rough. Ther: 14. Partly clear.

Monday, February 6

Working in shop, a.m. Stripping tobacco, p.m. Very slippery walking this morning. Cold & damp. Ther: 30. Cloudy.

Tuesday, February 7

Stripping tobacco all day. Stormy & rough p.m. Ther: 40. Partly clear.

Wednesday, February 8 Stripping tobacco partly all day. Went over to C. B. Miller's with Amos McAllister this eve. to attend a prayer meeting given in honor of Grandmother whose 84th birthday was today. She is well & looks as though she may be able to see many more, the Lord willing. Cool all day. Ther: 34. Clear.

Thursday, February 9

Visiting schools all day. Wm E. Miller, M. M. Bortzfield, Director & myself visited the Central Graded, H. A. Evans, teacher & East Center, A. R. Caldwell, teacher, a.m. Mr. Caldwell accompanied us to the West Centre, Miss Katie Buckwalter, teacher & Fairview, Miss Annie B. Urban, teacher, p.m. Am very much pleased with the schools. Made school address at Caldwell's & Miss Urban. Miss Urban is a hard worker and gets good results. Snowing this eve. Ther: 30. Partly cloudy.

Friday, February 10

Stripping tobacco all day. Raining partly a.m. Snow all gone this morning. Getting very muddy. Ther: 44. Cloudy.

Saturday, February 11

Brought up balance of tobacco from below, a.m. Working about home p.m. Mr. Noacher came this eve., to remain over Sunday. At Missionary Society in eve. Ther: 34. Partly cloudy.

Sunday, February 12

At Sunday school & preaching. Text: Matt 13, 1x2, a.m. At consistory meeting, etc., p.m. At preaching in eve. Text: 1 King 6, 37 & 38. Commencing to snow. Very damp. S.E. Wind. Ther: 30. Partly clear.

Monday, February 13

Stripping tobacco all day. At J. R. Yentzer's in eve. attending to church matters. River very high & dangerous. Raining a.m. Snow p.m. Ther: 34. Cloudy.

Tuesday, February 14

Stripping tobacco all day. Finished. Henry Kendig brought sink & wood chest to shop to have painted. River falling fast. Valentine day. Snow melting fast. Ther: 30. Clear.

Wednesday, February 15

Cleaning out shop a.m. Painting sink & wood box, etc., p.m. I am 36 years old today. How time does fly. Set 2 hens today. 13 eggs each. Snow melting. Terrible muddy. Ther: 30. Partly cloudy.

Thursday, February 16

Working in shop. N. Wade got walnut lumber: 65 cents, a.m. At Jos G. Rankin's sale. Had a good sale. 1 pair mules bought for \$400, p.m. Roads very muddy. Ther: 38. Partly clear.

Friday, February 17

Working in shop all day. Began snowing about 1 p.m. & continued all p.m. Snow about 5 inches deep this eve. & is still snowing. David Sangrey's son buried today. Ground frozen. Roads very rough. Ther: 28. Cloudy.

Saturday, February 18

Working in shop a.m. At Jos Dellinger's sale. Bought ax, flail & grubbing hoe & hat rack. He had a good sale, p.m. At IORM in eve. The Tribe received new Adoption & Funeral books and I acted as Sachem. Burned the old rituals. The new ones will be used next meeting. Snow between 7 & 8 inches deep. (J. F. C. 16 p lumber: 20 cents). Some sleighing. Ther: 26. Partly cloudy.

Sunday, February 19

At Sunday school & prayer a.m. At home. Wife & Mrs. Wm Smith went down to see Mrs. Charles Trissler, p.m. Sleighs are running. Ther: 25. Partly clear.

Monday, February 20 In shop partly all day. A terrible blizzard struck this town between 9 & 10 o'clock. Snowing for about 1/2 hour with very heavy storm. Quite a number of folks we're compelled to seek shelter in barns & houses on account of the intense storms & snow. Some losing their way going from M. E. Church. No mail today, the roads being drifted terribly. The hill at M. E. B.'s store is level from bank to bank. Very high wind all day. Ther: 10. Clear.

Tuesday, February 21

Township election. Not doing much. Total vote: 275.

Judge: Rep., Jos Wells, 206, Dem., H. Martin, 51. Inspector: Rep., Michael Kneisley, 170, Dem., H. S. Stehman, 28, A. H. Benedict, 59. Constable: Rep., Ed Dutch, 220, Dem., G. W. Pearce, 34. S.D.: Rep., F. Shoff, 186, E. H. Zercher, 157, Dem., D. Sangrey, 57, W. A. Haskell, 27, Jos Harnish, 16. Sup.: Rep. Geo Garrett, 196, Y. H. Shenk, Dem., Tobias Hoak, 53, C. Benedict, 26, Fred Wise, 17 Tax Col.: Rep., M. Benedict, 234, Dem., Adam Brady, 25 Town Clerk: Rep., Theo Jones, 214, Dem., Wm Funk, 24. Auditor: Rep., Amos Good, 209, Dem., Jacob Pickel, 38. Cold & damp. Snow in eve. Rec'd \$2.80 of H. Martin on acct. Ther: 21. Partly cloudy.

Wednesday, February 22

Working in shop all day. Snowed about 4 inches last night. Snow drifting very fast. The roads are almost entirely closed. No driving at all. Mail came by horseback this eve. The roads that were opened yesterday are entirely closed again. It will cost the township about \$400 or \$500 to open the roads. Very stormy all day & still blowing. Ther: 28. Partly clear.

Thursday, February 23

Working on road shoveling snow. They are terribly drifted from M. M. Bortz's to Harnish woods. There is not one inch of the road that

is not drifted 4 to 8 ft deep. At Jacob Harnish's tobacco shed the snow banks are 15 ft high some places. I never seen the equal. S.W. wind. Colder in eve. Ther: 28. Partly clear.

Friday, February 24

Working in shop all day. Am very sore of shoveling yesterday. Painted 1/2 doz. chairs for Geo W. Shaub: \$1.00. Sink & wood chest for Henry Kendig: \$1.30. Chair for Jacob B. Harnish: 65 cents. John Graver reel (Painting): 50 cents. Geo worked 1/2 day on road for me. Damp, raw air. Ther: 32. Partly cloudy.

Saturday, February 25

Shoveling snow & Geo worked at same for me, a.m. In shop, etc., p.m. Charles Trissler paid balance of market wagon, less meat bill: \$6.65, in full, p.m. At IORM in eve. Mary Fralich came here this p.m. Weather very changeable. Less cloudy. Rain & snow today. Ther: 28. Partly cloudy.

Sunday, February 26

At Sunday school & preaching by Rev. _. Text: 2 Timothy 4 & 7-8, a.m. At home & Dr. Witmer's. Mary Fralich & children went away, p.m. At preaching in eve. Text: 2 Cor. 11 + 1-4. H. H. Kurtz daughter, Maggie, died this morning. Snow melting fast. Ther: 25. Clear.

Monday, February 27

Went over to Miller's & to see Grandmother, etc., a.m. Put in set casters for Hellen Lawrence: \$2.52, paid. H. C. McAllister brought load of coal from Safe Harbor for me, p.m. Sent check to P. C. & Co. for coffin: \$9.75. Roads getting very sloppy. Ther: 24. Partly clear.

Tuesday, February 28 Went to Harrisburg. There all day. Paid my

man, T.F. Bell, \$35.00 on account. Had a pleasant time. Met Miss Landis Eby & Heidlebach. Came back to Lancaster in eve. Weather very unpleasant. Sleet, rain & snow. I do not think I ever saw flakes so large before. Ther: 32. Cloudy.

Wednesday, March 1

Went to West Chester via Frager Fair: \$2.59 round trip. Went to see Edward Walter's (Enneaka Farm) Stock & Poultry. I was certainly delighted. I saw a Dorset Horned ram (Dorset, England) & received a sample of wool right from the back that measured 12 in long & very fine. Also ordered 5 setting of eggs: L.B., A.D. & S.C.B.L. The trees are on coat of ice & look like so much silver in the sun. P. C. Hiller & G. W. Prior were kind enough to bring me. Clear.

Thursday, March 2

Working in shop partly all day painting, etc. Roads very sloppy. Ther: 32. Clear.

Friday, March 3

Working in shop all day painting, etc. Sent a load of walnut to Bartholomew (Dave) to have surfaced by H. C. McAllister. Did not bring it along back. Sold market carriage to Fred K. Shoff for \$70.00. Got his note for &40.00 & balance in trade. Ther: 36. Partly cloudy.

Saturday, March 4

Working in shop partly all day. Grover Cleveland & Adlai Stevenson we're inaugurated Pres & Vice Pres of the U.S. today. At IORM Proposed O. F. Bruner for membership this eve. Snowing partly all day & very stormy. Drifting fast. Ther: 28. Cloudy.

Sunday, March 5

At Sunday school & prayer meeting. Made a short address to school by request of Supt.,

a.m. At home p.m. O. F. Bruner here p.m. At M. E. Church in eve. Rev. Deacon preached his farewell sermon this eve. Snow drifting. Stormy partly all day. Ther: 17. Partly clear.

Monday, March 6

At Lancaster all day. Got hardware, etc., for shop. Went in with mare in sleigh. Roads drifted very bad. Had to go through the fields about 1/2 the way. Jacob Bitts got 4 lb. paint including can: 64 cents. Snow melting fast. Ther: 24. Clear.

Tuesday, March 7

Working in shop all day. Got word of the death of Jacob Hebel's child. Funeral Thursday at 9 at house & 10 at New Mennonite Church, New Danville. Working at coffin all day (covered) 2x6. Sold N. Wade 20 cents worth of lumber. Cash, 20 cents for same. Wife at Yentzer's this eve. in company with Mrs. Bortzfield. A few snowflakes fell today. Snow melting fast. Ther: 32. Partly clear.

Wednesday, March 8

Working in shop all day. O. F. Bruner took rough box out to New Mennonite burying ground this a.m. Noah Wade got 42 cents worth lumber. Wife out at Wm Caldwell's all day. Snow melting very fast. Ther: 56. Clear (partly all day).

Thursday, February 9

Attending funeral of Jacob Hebel's child (Martha), aged 7 mo. & 23 days. Buried at New Mennonite Church, New Danville. Rev. Henry Fisher preached from St. John 10+9. Had H. C. McAllister's horse & buggy for same. Paid him 75 cents for same. Very unpleasant. Raining partly all day. Charged \$8.00. Roads are very bad & snow going very fast. Ther: 50. Cloudy.

Friday, March 10

Working in shop. Sold my tobacco to Dr. I. M.

Witmer 8 3/4 & 2, a.m. Delivered 403 lb. wrappers. Deliver the balance of them tomorrow & working about home, p.m. Got word to attend the funeral of John Goutner tomorrow at 10 at his father's home at Safe Harbor & 2 at Highville U.B. Church. Very damp all day. Ther: 48. Cloudy.

Saturday, March 11

Delivered balance of tobacco (wrappers) Lot, 877 lbs. at 8 3/4 cents per pound: \$76.73 & went to attend funeral of John Goutner, son of Saml Goutner, Safe Harbor. Aged 45-5-2. Buried at Highville U.B. Church. Rev. Boughter preached from 1 Saml 15-32. Mr. A. C. Rote of Lancaster brought him out yesterday. I do not think I ever drove worse roads. At IORM in eve. First nomination night. Will give them on next Saturday. Very damp & rain. Bought water of Dr. I. M. Witmer. Ther: 50. Cloudy. No sun.

Sunday, March 12

At Sunday school & by Rev. Noacher. Text: St. Luke 7-14, a.m. At home. Wife & children at Dr. Witmer's p.m. At preaching in eve. Text: Daniel 3-5. Roads still very muddy. Cloudy in eve. Ther: 50. Partly clear.

Monday, March 13

Working about home making yard for P. Cochin for breeding. Helped H. C. McAllister to saw down oak (large) tree back of orchard at lane, etc., etc. At J. R. Yentzer's in eve., self & family. The Society of Willing Workers held an ice cream supper. Quite a number of folks were present & spent a very pleasant eve. They cleared \$11.00 from same. D. G. Kendig plowed sod today. Very much like spring. Drying fast. Ther: 56. Clear.

Tuesday, March 14

Working about home cleaning poultry house. Separated Cochins, etc. Finished Jacob Bitts furniture: \$3.45 & filed saw for M. H. Groff:

10 cents. Very damp. Rain p.m. Ther: 41. Cloudy.

Wednesday, March 15

Working in shop a.m. At house wrighting, etc., p.m. Stormy. Getting colder. Ther: 38. Partly clear.

Thursday, March 16

Wrighting partly all a.m. Tying up grape vines, etc., etc., p.m. Paid John Graver \$10.00 in full for corn, 40 bus on ear, received last fall. Much colder & stormy all day. Ther: 18. Partly clear.

Friday, March 17

Working about home & J. R. Yentzer hauled up my straw (1 load) from down on place & I helped him to haul it & one for him, a.m. Geo & I sawing up large chestnut tree down on place, p.m. At home in eve. Caught another cold somehow. The debate between Rohrer & Eshleman is on but very light attendance. Resolved that we should have the Prohibition Ticket at the fall election. Raw, damp air all day. Ther: 32. Partly cloudy.

Saturday, March 18

Heavy frost this morning. Went down & cut up large chestnut tree. Finished it till noon. The rings on the stump indicated that it was 101 years old when cut, a.m. Working about home p.m. At IORM in eve. Feel very sore on my fall at Yentzer's yesterday. Fell down straw hole in barn & caught myself at post. Ther: 34. Partly clear.

Sunday, March 19

At Sunday school & prayer meeting a.m. Andrew Good & Wife spent the p.m. with us & took supper at home in eve. Geo E. Lawrence here. Ther: 36. Partly clear.

Monday, March 20

At Lancaster all day on business. Saw Mr.

night in front of shop & broke it on his way to market, etc., p.m. At Preparatory Service & Missionary Service in eve. Warm & pleasant. Clear.

Sunday, October 8

At Sunday school & preaching. Text: St. John 10-9. Holy Communion a.m. At Consistory meeting. Paid Rev. Noacher salary in full to date & home, p.m. At church in eve. Rev. Noacher preached his last sermon as pastor of this charge to a large audience, the church being crowded. I am sorry that he is going away, he being a very fine Christian man. Warm. Clear.

Monday, October 9

Working in shop. Made pie board, 25 cents & painted weather vane, 25 cents, etc., a.m. Trimming limbs & burning brush, etc., p.m. Sold 50 lb. young chickens at 9 cents = \$4.50 to Martin Groff, Safe Harbor. Very pleasant & warm.

Working about home all day putting wood in stable & getting ready for my coal. Wife up home all day. Got 10 S.C.W. leghorn hens of W. H. Groff. Geo W. Brenner buried at Old Mennonite Church this p.m. From Lancaster. Warm all day. Clear.

Wednesday, October 11

Putting up shed for small chicks. H. C. McAllister hauling coal: 5 cents per ton. Got word that Eliza Stump had died in at the Alms House & she had requested that I bring her out & bury her at the colored graveyard, this place. I went in for her, but when I got there they had buried her on Tuesday already, so I left her rest. M. M. Bortzfield was along in. Warm all day. Clear.

Thursday, October 12 Finished shed for chicks. H. C. McAllister finished hauling coal from A. G. Hudson. 4 tons. Hauling: \$2.60. Pleasant. Partly clear.

Friday, October 13

Working about lot, etc., a.m. In shop p.m. Raining partly all p.m. The most rain we have had for quite a while. Cooler. Partly cloudy.

Saturday, October 14

Working about home. Very heavy storm last night. Blowed over trees, fences, sheds, etc. At IORM in eve. Cool all day. Partly clear.

Sunday, October 15

At Sunday school & prayer meeting a.m. Stopped up at Father Bruner's for dinner & spent part of the p.m. Partly cloudy.

Working in shop part of p.m. At church in eve. Had no overcoat on. Light rain a.m. Just like spring. Partly clear.

Sunday, December 24

About home all day. Lizzie Zercher Hershey & her husband spent part of the day with us & took dinner here. They are just newly married. Had a pleasant time. At M. E. Church in eve. They had their Christmas service. Saml Myers was buried today. Very much like spring. Ther: 32. Partly cloudy.

Monday, December 25

Took chest over to John Helbel's. Paid for same: \$4.50. Went to a Rock Hill, to Grandmother's & home. Got a lot of calendars for advertising & got Charles Smith to go from house to house to distribute them. At church in eve. Had Cantata by the Sunday school. Receipts: \$25.80. Beautiful day. Very warm. We spent a pleasant Christmas. Ther: 70 (80 in Shade). Partly clear.

Tuesday, December 26

Went to Lancaster to settle definitely with regard to mill but was put off till Thursday on account of Mr. Haskel not being present. Loaned O. F. Bruner \$20.00 for a short time. Stayed at Hasting's Hotel this eve. Cold & stormy. Partly clear.

Wednesday, December 27

Went to Williamsport this morning. Started at 6:30 & returned to Lancaster at 8:40 p.m. Had a very pleasant time. Spent 4 1/2 hours there. Contracted with the National Furniture Co. for 10 cupboards for school houses for \$5.50 in white. Went to Wmsport Upholstering Co. & A. W. Heilman. Each have large factories. A beautiful city. At Hasting's tonight. Cool & damp all day. Partly clear.

Thursday, December 28

At Lancaster all day. Mr. Haskel came in about Mill, but nothing definite. I am not sure that I will go & told Mr. Haskel that I claim the right to withdraw my bid as this is the third time they had set & failed to do anything.

Home in eve. Light snow in morning & cold. Clear p.m. Partly cloudy.

Friday, December 29

Sent check to Clarence Brooks. Working in shop & put 2 weather strips on doors for Mrs. Eby. She went to her children to spend the winter & locked her house, a.m. Went to Safe Harbor & brought up furniture from station. Sent check to Clarence Brooks for \$9.75 for varnish. Working in shop this eve. School board chairs: \$3.50. Very damp. Light showers. Warm. Partly.

Saturday, December 30

In shop partly all day. Varnished sink & varnished cottage suit for J. F. Caldwell. At IORM in eve. Paid school tax to M. Benedict: \$2.40. Miller Foutz was buried today. Snowing, etc., partly all day. Cloudy.

Sunday, December 31

At Sunday school & preaching by Rev. Miller. Text: St. Luke 2+5. Had a Consistory meeting in p.m. & the following officers were elected. Pres.: J. R. Yentzer. Secy.: A. J. Zercher. At preaching in eve. by same. Text: Ephe. 5+16. A good sermon. Treating on the closing & the opening of the new year. Partly clear.
