Diary of Andrew J. Zercher 1896 Transcribed by Fred Schenck Nov. 2021

Wednesday, January 1

In shop in morning. Filed saw for M. M. Bortzfield. Helped Flinchbaugh at his tax notices balance of day. Cool, raw air all day. Few flakes of snow. Ther: 28. Partly cloudy.

Thursday, January 2

In shop. Filed saw for M. H. Groff & working at coffins, a.m. Went over to Uncle C. B. Miller's & filled 2 chaff bags with straw. He did not charge me anything for it, p.m. Aunt Lizzie has the sciatic rheumatism. Not able to do anything. At Jr. OUAM in eve. Deputy Councilor, William Gundaker installed the officers for us. Had a good meeting. Will hold a newbie meeting on the 16th. Cool all day. Ther: 26. Partly clear.

Friday, January 3

Working in shop partly all day. Helped Flinchbaugh to fill out his Militia roll for Tuesday next. I have a bad cold. Stormy all day. Getting cold. Ther: 28. Partly cloudy.

Saturday, January 4

Working in shop partly all day. At IORM in eve. The therm was not above 16 at any time today. Got 128 lb. beef of D. B. Foutz to salt & dry. Cold & stormy all day. Getting colder. Ther: 10. Partly clear.

Sunday, January 5

At Sunday school & Missionary. The following were elected officers of the Missionary Society: Pres.: Charles Smith. V.P.: A. J. Zercher. Secy.: Beckie Carrigan. Treas.: J. R. Yentzer. Solicitor: Mrs. Kate Smith, Mrs. Martha Zercher & Miss Ella Good, a.m. Went out to MES. Preaching by Rev Beals. Text: Matt 6+10, p.m. Wm Caldwell here in eve.

Very cold all day. Therm not above 14 all day. Ther: 7. Partly clear.

Monday, January 6

Went to Lancaster this morning. Traded buggy on ready mixed paint with Shroder Smith & Shroder. Returned home 4 p.m. At J. R. Yentzer in eve. Settled up with Sunday school accounts. Rec'd during year \$43.95. Expended during year \$33.00. Bal. in my hand as Treas, \$10.95. Cold all day. Moderating. Snow. Ther: 8. Partly cloudy.

Tuesday, January 7

Hanging up pork & pot smoking, etc., a.m. Working in shop p.m. Beckie Kendig here serving for wife & Delilah Bruner helping all day. Very raw, chilly air all day. Ther: 18. Cloudy.

Wednesday, January 8

Not doing much today. Am not well at all. Beckie Kendig here serving all day. The folks started hauling ice today. Rather cold all day. Ther: 17. Clear.

Thursday, January 9

Working in shop partly. Feel some better. Beckie Kendig finished serving this a.m. Kendig & Groff are busy hauling ice. At Jr. QUAM. in eve. Wife & children went up home to spend the eve. Filed 2 saws for M. H. Groff, 30 cents. Raw air. Moderating. Trying to snow. Ther: 23. Partly cloudy.

Friday, January 10

Working about house, salting meat, etc., a.m. Working in shop p.m. Got 10 bus shelled corn of Jacob Graver. Raw air, but pleasanter. Ther: 25. Partly cloudy.

Saturday, January 11

Working in shop partly all day. At Safe Harbor at IOOF in eve. J. R. Yentzer gave an entertainment for the benefit of the AOK of MC as they bought the Graded school house

& converted the lower room into a public hall. None of the family attended. Raw, cold air all day. Ther: 25. Partly clear.

Sunday, January 12

At Sunday school. Made my report as treasurer. Rec'd during year, \$43.95. Expenses, \$33.00. Balance on hand, \$10.95, a.m. At preaching by Rev Gerhard. Text: St. Luke 2+40, p.m. Went out to Wm Caldwell's to spend the eve with family. Very pleasant day. Warmer. Partly clear.

Monday, January 13

At Lancaster partly all day. Traded trotting wagon to Shroder Smith & Shroder on mixed paint & got the agency for same for Mr. Bruner. Got things for shop. Telegraphed W. F. Bruner, Philadelphia, of the death of Mrs. Pennypacker. Funeral on Wednesday. Raw air all day. Ther: 23. Partly clear.

Tuesday, January 14

Working in shop all day. Cold all day. Getting colder. Ther: 24. Partly cloudy.

Wednesday, January 15

Working in shop & went to funeral of Philena Pennypacker, aged 82 years, 5 mo., 28 d. Rev. Gerhard preached. Text: 23 Psalm, 6 verse. J. J. Good, D. H. Miller, Amos R. Benedict, Anna Graver bearers. Mr. Fralich of Mountville had the funeral, but took charge here, a.m. M. Benedict & I visited the Graded & Primary school at West End. Pretty well pleased with them. Took Mrs. W. F. Bruner & B. Martin to Millersville. Cold all day. Ther: 24. Partly clear.

Thursday, January 16

Went over to Willow Street after Dr. Gatchel for to meet Dr. Witmer at Geo Rathfon's. He is sick, a.m. Working in shop p.m. At Jr. OUAM in eve. A number of Jr. Council present after which there was a public meeting held in the Hall. Speakers: H. R. Fulton, Wm Gundaker,

Past State Councilor who spoke on the principles of the order. Wife at Book's. Cold all day. Ther: 20. Partly clear.

Friday, January 17

Went over to Rock Hill, etc., a.m. In shop p.m. Moderating. Raw air. Partly clear.

Saturday, January 18

Working in shop a.m. Cleaned hen house, etc. Aunt Barbara & cousin Lizzie Hess spent p.m. here. At IORM in eve. Beautiful day all day. Quite spring like. Clear.

Sunday, January 19

At Sunday school a.m. At Grandmother's & Uncle Christ Miller's p.m. At home in eve. Snowing slowly partly all day. Looks as though it would turn to rain. Cloudy.

Monday, January 20

At Lancaster. Edw Duke went along & returned. Got home about 3 p.m. Snow this morning that rabbit could be tracked. Moderating. Cloudy.

Tuesday, January 21

Working in shop all day. Moderating. Damp partly all day. Partly cloudy.

Wednesday, January 22

Working in shop partly all day. Took A. F. Martin to Safe Harbor. He paid \$1.00. Over to Benj Lawyer for the IOOF on acct of the IORM loan in eve. Damp all day. Not cold. Cloudy.

Thursday, January 23

Working in shop all day. Much warmer. Raining partly all of p.m. & heavy in eve. Partly cloudy.

Friday, January 24

Working in shop all day. Rained best part of night & raining partly all day. Frost coming out. Cloudy.

Saturday, January 25

Working in shop & cleaning hen house, etc., a.m. Attending the primary election. I organized the meeting. The regular election board served with the exception of Bro Emanuel. I took his place as clerk. Following was the ticket & votes received. Judge 87 votes polled. Jacob Henry, 258. Inspector: Jacob Morrison, 162, J. B. Urban, 33, Val Kneisley, 80. Supervisor: A. R. Benedict, 192, Mich Lefever, 60, H. H. Warfel, 110, W. C. Bowers, 155, D. B. Warfel, 12. School Director: E. H. Zercher, 148, Fred Shoff, 214, Amos Warfel, 134. Constable: Ed Duke, 246. Auditor: Andrew Good, 248. Town Clerk: Theo Jones, 251. Pleasant day. Muddy. Partly cloudy.

Sunday, January 26

At Sunday school a.m. At preaching by Rev. Gerhard. Text: Rom 1+17. Ida Good was received into the church by baptism & confirmation & Amelia Good Terry's infant was baptized. At home in eve. Wife & children up at home & her & Delilah went out to see Mrs. Jacob Bitts. Damp all day. Getting cooler. Partly cloudy.

Monday, January 27

Working in shop all day. Sent Building & Loan recpts to Lancaster with H. H. Kurtz & the Certificate of Nomination of Saturday. I gave my team to him & John Wade. Pleasant all day. Partly clear.

Tuesday, January 28

Got word last night at 12 of the death of Geo Rathfon. Went up & shaved & washed him. Went up this morning & embalmed the body. Funeral on Thursday at 2 at House & 2:30 at church at New Danville New Mennonite. Working in shop all day at coffin & rough box. Beautiful day. Clear.

Wednesday, January 29 Working in shop. Took rough box out to New

Danville & stools up to house, a.m. In shop p.m. Took coffin up & put corpse in this eve. He looks very natural. Mrs. McLaughlin made the shroud. The family are very much pleased with everything. Beautiful day. Very much like spring. Clear.

Thursday, January 30

Attending funeral of George Rathfon, aged 78-11-25. Rev. Hershe preached. Text: 2 Timothy 4x7. Bearers: A. T. Buckwalter, Amos Herr, John Allen, Elmer Trout, David Harnish, Martin Musser. 25 carriages. Very large funeral. He looked just as he did in life. Very natural. He had a walnut coffin. 6 [Oxeddred] handles. \$2.00. Beautiful weather a.m. Partly cloudy p.m. Partly clear.

Friday, January 31

Went to Rathfon's & changed some beds. Brought stools home & working in shop, etc. Albert Smith got team to go to an entertainment at Stephen's School House, Manor Twp & going up along the creek near Rock Hill they upset & broke the carriage. Damp partly all day. Partly cloudy.

Saturday, February 1

Working in shop a.m. In shop & cleaned hen house, etc. Albert Smith brought the carriage over to Amos Martin to have it repaired. Mrs. Rathfon sent word for me to come up & paid me for burying her husband. She is very well pleased with my work. At IORM in eve. Damp partly all day. Partly cloudy.

Sunday, February 2

An order for block of ? was drawn. At Sunday school & Missionary meeting a.m. The children & I walked over to Grandmother & Miller's p.m. At home in eve. Mr. Bruner & family here to spend the eve. & Wm Caldwell here. Damp, cool air all day. Partly clear.

Monday, February 3 At Lancaster by stage. Got things for shop,

etc. Paid Wm Caldwell's note of \$40.00 at A.A.B. for him. My wife & Mr. Bruner & wife went to the funeral of John Heiser at Lexington. Funeral tomorrow at 9:30 a.m. Word was left at home of the death of Frank Campbell child at Safe Harbor. Went down in eve. Funeral on Wednesday at house. Raining a.m. Snowing p.m. Very unpleasant all day. Roads getting bad. Cloudy.

Tuesday, February 4

Working in shop at coffin a.m. Went to Fred Shoff Sale with Wm Caldwell. He wanted to buy a cow but could not suit himself. Working in shop this eve. Wife came home from funeral this eve. Not very well. Bought 1 bus wheat at Shoff's Mill, 70 cents. Paid for same. The first sleighs of the season appeared today, but very colder. Snowing partly all day. Cloudy.

Wednesday, February 5

Working in shop. Finished coffin, etc., a.m. Attended funeral of John Augustus, infant son of Frank Campbell, aged 1 mo. & 14 days. Rev. Tobias Finnefrock spoke at House in a general way. No text. Buried at O. M. Church, River Corner. Writing out by laws for Jr. OUAM in eve. Set one hen today. Raw, damp air. Very bad roads.

Thursday, February 6

Finished writing by laws for our council, etc, a.m. In shop, etc., p.m. At home in eve. Rained partly all last night & very heavy partly all day. Thunder gust this noon. Real heavy thunder. Not cold. Snow partly all gone. Cloudy.

Friday, February 7

Working in shop partly all day. The weather vein on the new school building here blew off last night, breaking in several pieces & cutting several holes in the tin roof. Just as I prophecied as it was entirely too heavy for

the height. Getting colder. Very heavy storm last night. Great change from yesterday. Partly clear.

Saturday, February 8

Working in shop a.m. & part of p.m. Cleaning hen house, horse stable, etc. H. W. Hess here this eve .to see about furniture. Will bring his wife up to see & what I do not have I am to buy for them at Lancaster. Paid him \$6.46 for hay received from Adam Hess. Cool, damp air all day. Snowing in eve. Partly clear.

Sunday, February 9

At Sunday school a.m. At preaching by Rev. Gerhard. Text: Matt 8+13, Luke 7+14. About ? inches of snow this morning. Light rain a.m. Stormy & colder p.m. Partly cloudy.

Monday, February 10

At Lancaster attending a meeting of the County Committee. We set March 21st for the county primary. Brought things along for shop, etc. P. C. Hiller along in & out. Took Mr. Bruner's deed along into Mr. Groff, Esq. to have a new one made for H. F. Bruner. Getting colder. Bad roads. Partly clear.

Tuesday, February 11

Working in shop partly all day. Graining, varnishing, etc. Much colder & increasing. Partly cloudy.

Wednesday, February 12

Working in shop partly all day. Wife & I went over to Owen's. He had a supper, it being his birthday. Large number of folks there & a fine supper. Cool all day. Ther: 24. Clear.

Thursday, February 13

In shop, etc., all day. At Jr. OUAM in eve. Snowed this morning. Turned to rain & rained partly all day. Cold rain. Cloudy.

Friday, February 14

Working in shop a.m. At the sale of Henry

Conrad on Willow Street Pike with Wm Caldwell p.m. Got tools & contents of shop where I work insured & got the policy this eve. Rec'd the By Laws of Jr. OUAM this eve. that I sent off a week ago. Abrm Warfel should have had it done 3 mos. ago, but neglected it. Raw wind all day. Partly clear.

Saturday, February 15

In shop a.m. In shop & cleaning hen house, etc. Saml Henry brought his rocker away from shop but did not pay for it., p.m. At IORM & at concert in the Hall for the benefit of the band. Mrs. M. M. Bortzfield used home for her parents & her children. Charles had went along with John & Flora over on a visit & Mrs. Bortzfield sent the team home with him. She walked home in p.m. I feel sorry for Mart. Fine weather. Partly clear.

Sunday, February 16

At Sunday school & prayer meeting. The children missed Sunday school. I think they are both getting the mumps, a.m. About home p.m. Harry Martin & Wife here this eve. They told us that their daughter, Bertha, is getting married next Tuesday to Harry Long, a Roman Catholic. I feel sorry for them & her. Snowing a.m. & much colder & getting still colder. Partly cloudy.

Monday, February 17

At Lancaster. Took Mrs. Geo Rathfon in to her daughter, Mrs. Hostetter, 143 N. Shippen St. Brought things out for shop. Very cold all day. Coldest day of the year thus far. Ther: zero. Clear.

Tuesday, February 18

Clerking at township election all day. The following were elected. Total vote polled, 139. Judge: Jacob Henry, 133. Inspector: Jacob W. Momson, 85, J. B. Urban, 26. Constable: Ed Duke, 127. School Director: E. H. Zercher, 125, Fred Shoff, 125. Supervisor:

Amos R. Benedict, 128, W. C. Bowers, 131. Town Clerk: Theo Jones, 129. Auditor: Andrew Good,128. Cold all day. Few flakes snow p.m. Ther: 5. Partly cloudy.

Wednesday, February 19

Took picture figure to Harry Martin's & at Jos M. Kreider doing some work, a.m. Went over to C. B. Miller & helped at chicken house p.m. Snowed part of the p.m. & getting much colder. Stormy & rough. Ther: 24. Partly cloudy.

Thursday, February 20

About home & went over to C. B. Miller's about 10 a.m. & worked at chicken house balance of day. It is certainly cold to work out, especially when you are used to working in a warm shop. Finished for just now. At OUAM in eve. Stormy. Very cold all day. Ther: 7. Partly cloudy.

Friday, February 21

Working in shop partly all day. We heard that Mrs. Bortzfield & children came to Mart last eve. I hope it will result in good. Very stormy & cold all day. Ther: 11. Partly clear.

Saturday, February 22

Working in shop partly all day. At IORM in eve. Cold. Not so stormy a.m. Moderating p.m. Ther: 13. Partly clear.

Sunday, February 23

At Sunday school a.m. & at preaching by Rev. Gerhard. Text: St. John 10+24, p.m. Peter Bruner & family here from Gap & took supper with us. At song service in eve. I read the 6 Psalm for a Servant Use Lesson. We expected to hold them every 4 weeks. Beautiful a.m. Rather damp p.m. & bitter rain in eve. Ther: 36. Partly cloudy.

Monday, February 24
Went to Lancaster in morning. Took

bookcase doors along in to have shaped. Gave an adv to Mr. Roy for in Ezra Good's hotel register, Marticville, \$2.00. Brought poplar & doors for case (book) along out. Rob Evan's Father of the Fountain Inn Hotel skipped last night with about \$90.00 of money. Warm all day. Cooler in eve. Partly cloudy.

Tuesday, February 25

Working in shop all day. Milton Heidlebaugh, candidate for assembly, here to see me. Getting colder & stormy all day. A little snow storm. Ther: 26. Partly cloudy.

Wednesday, February 26

Working in shop all day. Grant Gardner hauled 1 ton of coal from A. G. Hudson. Cold, damp air all day. Light snow this eve. Partly cloudy.

Thursday, February 27

Working in shop a.m. Went along with P. M. Bruner to Mt. Nebo to appraise damages caused by fire of S. C. Stevenson Shop to John F. Brubaker house. Damages, \$10.00. Went from there to Oscar Erb's Sale, p.m. At Jr. OUAM in eve. F. H. Sickmans was admitted by card. Beautiful day. Ther: 36. Partly cloudy.

Friday, February 28

Working in shop all day. Cleaned hen house & stable in eve. Regular spring weather. Commenced rain this eve. Partly cloudy.

Saturday, February 29

Took Mrs. Mary Hatter to Safe Harbor to meet the train for Baltimore. She had been at her aunt, Mrs. Barbara Rathfon, a.m. About home. Wrote deed for Amos & David Stevenson for the Isaac McLaughlin property, etc., p.m. At Graded school entertainment in the eve. Mrs. Georgia Jones, teacher. I had charge of the door for her. Rained heavy last

night & part of a.m. Very muddy roads. Cloudy.

Sunday, March 1

At Sunday school & Missionary meeting a.m. At home p.m. Wife & children went over to Grandmother's & Miller's to spend the p.m. Changeable. Getting colder. Rather stormy. Partly cloudy.

Monday, March 2

At Lancaster by stage. Paid B&S & got things for shop & attended a meeting of the Co.-Committee. A resolution was passed to assess the candidate via prothonotary: \$25 Register, \$15 Sheriff, \$25 Treas, Clerk of Guest Session \$25, Orphan Court \$15, Prison Keeper \$10, Coroner \$10, Co Commissioners \$10, Congress \$25, Senator \$10, Assembly \$5, Delegates to I.C. \$5. Also the people to vote their choice for President. Cold & stormy. Very stormy p.m.

Tuesday, March 3

Working in shop a.m. In shop & at J. H. Shank's Sale, p.m. At home in eve. Wm Caldwell, Owen & Raymond here. Very high wind all night. Geo Herr's barn burned down near Baumgardner's Station. 19 head of cattle & all contents, etc., except the horses on Monday between 4 & 5 a.m. Cause not known. Very stormy & cold. Ther: 21. Partly clear.

Wednesday, March 4

Working in shop a.m. Delivered furniture to H. W. Hess & bedstead to A. F. Martin, p.m. Jacob Omet came here this eve. & stayed overnight. Stormy all day & cold. Ther: 19. Partly clear.

Thursday, March 5

Working in shop a.m. Went along with Wm Caldwell to John Long's Sale. He bought a cow for \$40.00, cr of sale 6 month. I went on

his note to Lanc Co Bank, p.m. At Jr. OUAM in eve. Blanche not in school on acct. of sore throat. Stormy all day but ceased in eve. Ther: 18. Partly clear.

Friday, March 6

Working in shop a.m. Went over to C. B. Miller's & put tar paper on chick house. Blanche & Charles not in school today on acct. of sore throat. Miss Jones, their teacher, spent part of the eve here. Moderating. Not nearly so cold. Partly cloudy.

Saturday, March 7

About home all day. At entertainment of the White Ribbon Quartette. Stormy & colder. Partly cloudy.

Sunday, March 8

At Sunday school a.m. At preaching by Rev. Gerhard. Text: St. Luke 11+1, p.m. Albert Charles & Wife took supper with us & spent a few hours. At preaching in eve. by same. Text: St. Luke 7+5. The Jufonur Lady was not with us on account of sickness. Stormy & cold all day. Partly clear.

Monday, March 9

At Lancaster. P. C. Hiller went along in. Benj F. Trissler, David B. Warfel, John Wade & Geo B. Eckman were arrested today for horse stealing & malicious mischief, preferred by H. H. Bitts & B. Frank Bitts. They are charged with taking 2 horses from the stable & killing them. I bailed Eckman for his appearance on Wednesday next at 10 a.m. with Alders Halbaugh for a hearing. I do not believe any of them are guilty. Very stormy all day. Partly clear.

Tuesday, March 10

About home all day. Fixed chair for Uncle Abrm M. Hess. Martin Good brought some to shop to repair. It is in the papers this eve.

with regard to the horse killing. Damp, raw east wind. Partly cloudy.

Wednesday, March 11

Went to Lancaster. Geo Eckman went along. The hearing of Benj F. Trissler, David B. Warfel, John Wade, & Geo Eckman, charged with horse stealing & malicious mischief was postponed till next Wednesday at 1 o'clock p.m. Bitts has J. Hay Brown & Thomas Whitson for attorney & the others have Benj F. Davis. Brought chair turnings along out for the shop. Snowing all day. Cloudy.

Thursday, March 12

Working in shop partly all day. The heaviest snow of the season. About 8 or 9 in deep this morning. Stormy & getting colder. Cloudy.

Friday, March 13

Working in shop partly all day. The supervision of shoveling snow at some places. Cold all day. Ther: 13. Partly clear.

Saturday, March 14

Working in shop partly all day. At IORM in eve. First nomination night Sachem: _. S.S.: Ed Duke. J.S.: B. F. Trissler. C of R: R. J. Zercher & B. F. Hookey. Asst K of W: A. F. Martin. Trustee: A. F. Martin. Janitor: Jacob Henry. Cold, raw air all day. Ther: 12. Partly cloudy.

Sunday, March 15

At Sunday school & prayer meeting a.m. At home p.m. Snowing partly all day. Cloudy.

Monday, March 16

At Lancaster all day. At Co.-Committee meeting a.m. Got suit for Charles, hat for self, cashmere, etc., for shop. Went in with stage. Very unpleasant all day. Snowing a.m. Raining p.m. Cloudy.

Tuesday, March 17

Working in shop all day. Pleasant day. Snow melting. Clear.

Wednesday, March 18

Working in shop a.m. At John G. Clark's sale p.m. Went over with Harry Bruner in sleigh. Good sleighing but snow is going fast. Beautiful day over head. Partly clear.

Thursday, March 19

Working in shop, etc., all day. At Jr. OUAM in eve. We got over by laws this eve. & well pleased. Wonderful how the snow went today. Raining heavy partly all a.m. & part of p.m. Cloudy.

Friday, March 20

About home, etc., all day. Changeable. Partly clear.

Saturday, March 21

Working in shop a.m. Attending Republican Primary (County) p.m. Very large vote polled (338). Policies make queer things happen. I do not see how some people who want to be very honorable can do the things they do. At IORM in eve. Pleasant day.

Sunday, March 22

At Sunday school a.m. At preaching by Rev. Gerhard. Text: St. John 6x9&10. Mr. Gerhard & Miss Georgia Jones took supper with us. Light rain a.m. Changeable p.m. Partly cloudy.

Monday, March 23

Went to Lancaster. Took wife & Mary Bruner along. I am certainly pleased with the result of Saturday's primary. Candidate on Quay faction was nominated. The Combine did not get a solitary one in the County. At Rev. Gerhard's attending a consistory meeting & I was elected to delegate to classes. Snowing partly all day. Colder. Ther: 20. Cloudy.

Tuesday, March 24

Working in shop a.m. Hauled cottage suit for Mrs. Myers (widow), etc., p.m. About 5 inches of snow fell yesterday. Very loose &

melted very fast today. Cold, raw air all day. Ther: 10. Partly clear.

Wednesday, March 25

Working in shop a.m. Hauled a load of furniture for Mrs. Myers, p.m. & in shop & took bedstead over to Mary Ressler, Marticville for Wm Gainer's daughter. Pleasant. Snow going fast. Partly clear.

Thursday, March 26

Hauled a load of household goods for Mrs. Myers this a.m. She moved from the old Myers' farm to John W. Urban's house, a.m. In shop, etc., p.m. At Jr. OUAM in eve. Pleasant but raw day. Partly clear.

Friday, March 27

Working in shop & hanging blinds for Mrs. Myers a.m. In shop p.m. Much colder. Ther: 22. Partly clear.

Saturday, March 28

Took desk & book case out to Henry Shenk near Steinman's Powder House, a.m. In shop p.m. At IORM in eve. The following officers were elected: S: J.S.B.: S.S.: M.M. B: J.S._. C of R: A.J.Z. Asst C of R:_ : KW: A.F.M. Rep. J.T.H. Trustee: H.W.H. Janitor: J. Henry. Good attendance. I was elected C of R. B. F. Thursday, July 9

Working about lot, etc., a.m. Went over to H. W. Hess & hung 2 screen doors. Rec'd pay for same. Up at Bruner's a while in eve. & Jr. OUAM in eve. Harry Trissler was initiated. Showery a.m. Warm all day. Partly cloudy.

Friday, July 10

Working in shop a.m. Repairing hen house p.m. W. F. Bruner left here this morning for Lancaster & will go home on Sunday. Warmer & threatening. Partly clear.

Saturday, July 11

Working in poultry house putting in floor, etc., & cleaning stables. At IOA.M in eve. J. M. Bruner left here for Lanc. He & Wm will go to the Gap to see Peter today & go home tomorrow eve. (Philadelphia). Very warm all day. Partly clear.

Sunday, July 12

At Sunday school a.m. At preaching by Rev.

Gerhard. Text: Numbers 23x10. He & his son Wm took supper with us. Mrs. j. M. Bruner & Mary spent the evening with us. Very warm all day. Ther: 91. Partly clear.

Monday, July 13

Working in shop, etc., a.m. In garden, etc., p.m. Warm all day. Partly clear.

Tuesday, July 14

At Lancaster all day. Jennie & Malie & Mary Bruner & my wife & I went to Rocky Springs on trolley B for a pleasure trip. I bore the expense, 50 cents for the round trip. We had a very pleasant time. Thursday, July 23

Working at plank walk all day. Got scantling (hemlock) of H. H. Stauffer, Safe Harbor. At Jr. OUAM in eve. Took sweet corn up to J. R. Yentzer to have evaporated. About 30 doz. Pleasant day. Partly clear.

Friday, July 24

Working at plank walk between showers. Moved the shed back of house up in the lot for them this eve 16+8. Amos Steinman & 5 others & myself got 12 ½ lbs. evaporated corn from what I took up to Yentzer's. Raining partly all day. Partly cloudy.

Saturday, July 25

Finished plank walk a.m. & reading away old walk. Cleaning hen house, etc., p.m. At IORM in eve. The following Committee was appointed to make arrangements for annual

supper on the 8th of August. B. F. Trissler, A. J. Zercher, Jacob Henry. Wife & children came home from Gap this eve. Was glad to see them. Grant Gardner got 42 ft of lumber, \$1.47. Warm all day. Partly clear.

Sunday, July 26

At teacher's meeting. I had charge (appointment for here, Henry Martin) & at Sunday a.m. At preaching by Rev. Dr. Henry Herman of Ohio, formerly of this place, who preached a powerful sermon from Philippians 1+20. Rev. Gerhard being sick, p.m. Went out to Wm Caldwell's in eve. Wednesday, July 29

Jacob Henry here. Cemented cistern. Charged 50 cents. Paid for same, a.m. Working in shop p.m. Family & I went up to Rev. H. S. Beals. Her parents are here from Illinois on a visit & are leaving for home tomorrow. We spent a very pleasant evening. Very warm & sultry. Ther: 89. Partly clear.

Thursday, July 30

Working in shop & put in shelves for Dr. I. M. Witmer, 50 cents & filed 2 saws for M. H. Groff, 25 cents. Took Mr. & Mrs. Wise to Safe Harbor. Rev. Mr. Beals wife's parents who are going home to Illinois again after spending about 4 weeks here. They are highly pleased with their visit. I brought load sawdust along back from Sourbeer's for hen house. Very warm all day.

Friday, July 31

Working in shop partly all day. Got 50 lb. feed of Groff & Trissler. 43 cents paid for same. Pleasant. Much cooler. Partly clear.

Saturday, August 1

Working in shop partly all day. Cleaning hen house, stable, etc. At IORM in eve.. Fetched Grandmother over this eve to stay till tomorrow eve. Uncle Christ went to Mt. Joy & she wanted to come over to our place till they return. Jacob Bitts is very sick. Pleasant all day. Partly cloudy.

Sunday, August 2

Light rain in morning. At teacher's meeting & Sunday school. Wm Smith was appointed for next Sunday's teacher's meeting. Missionary Society met after Sunday school, a.m. Amos McAllister spent p.m.& took supper with us & Grandmother. Took her home this eve. A. F. Martin had team to go to Millersville. His daughter (Mrs. Sheaffer), is poorly. Pleasant all day. Beautiful p.m. Partly cloudy.

Monday, August 3

Working about home, in shop ,etc., all day. Was asked to sit up with Jacob Bitts tonight by request of family. The Jr. OUAM will wait on him every night during his sickness. Very warm. Ther: 97. Partly clear.

Tuesday, August 4

Went to Lancaster this morning to bring out

paint for A. F. Martin's house. Chas was along. Home by 1:30 o'clock. Working about shop, p.m. Was out with Jacob Bitts all last night. Grant Warfel, M. B. Foutz there till 2 a.m. He is a very sick man, but I am in hopes he will pull through. Very warm all day. Ther: 96. Partly clear.

Wednesday, August 5

Started painting A. F. Martin's house this morning. Wm Henry helping, a.m. Got word this noon of the death of Jacob Bitts. Went out & took charge of body & by request of family, I will use icebox, which I have not used for about 2 years. I also embalmed. He is in bad condition. Out to look after ice & co in eve. His request was that I should bury him. Very warm all day. Ther: 96. Clear.

Thursday, August 6

Working in shop at casket for J. Bitts partly all day. Took case by M. E. cemetery & went to Safe Harbor for Miss Hatter of Baltimore & her trunk & brought her to Mrs. Barbara Rathfon's. kept better than I expected, a.m. He looked as though he was sleeping far better than I expected. I went to Safe Harbor to take charge of an infant of Isabella Herr, bury tomorrow p.m. No funeral. (Henry B. Sent a check to G. Reynolds for \$30.84, policy in A.W. L.S.) Ther: 97. Partly clear.

Sunday, August 9

Working at small casket this morning & at Sunday school. Rev. Bro M. M. Noacher addressed the school, a.m. Attended funeral of Isabella Herr, infant, aged 2 mo. & 5 days. Buried at M. E. Church, this place. At preaching by Rev. Noacher in eve. Text: Exodus 3+17. They were glad to hear him once again & he gave us work to do. (I was almost overcome by the heat). Very warm all day. The heat was very oppressive. Ther: 102.

Thursday, August 13

Went down home & to Eberley's. Let family down for a few days. Perhaps till Tuesday next. Very warm & dry day. Ther: 100. Partly clear.

Friday, August 14

Putting in glass & painting at Amos F. Martin's

all day. Self. Much cooler. This is the first day out of 12 that the therm did not reach 90 & over. Ther: 89. Partly clear.

Saturday, August 15

Not working much today. Had an attack of painter's cholic last night and am not feeling well at all today. At IORM in eve. Warm all day. Partly clear.

Sunday, August 16

At teacher's meeting & Sunday school & prayer meeting a.m. Preaching at M. E. Church p.m. At home in eve. Warm all day. Light showers. Partly cloudy.

Monday, August 17

At A. F. Martin's painting all day. Wm helping. Harry Eberley brought wife & children home this noon. He took dinner with us. Much cooler today. Partly clear.

Tuesday, August 18

Painting at A. F. Martin's all day. Will 3/4 day. Much cooler. Light rain p.m. Partly cloudy.

Wednesday, August 19

The papers reported snow in Philadelphia yesterday. Edw Pehlman, Dr. Witmer & myself left home for Mt. Gretna this morning at 4:30. Left Lancaster at 6:30 & we spent a very pleasant day at the farmer's picnic. A great variety of machinery & about 3000 or 4000 poultry. Different kinds. It was certainly worth seeing. I subscribed for "The Feather", a monthly journal, 50 cents. Returned home at 6 o'clock. Cool & pleasant all day. Partly clear.

Thursday, August 20

Painting at A. F. Martin's all day. Will & I. At Jr. OUAM in eve. Warmer. Cool in eve. Partly cloudy.

Friday, August 21

50 carriages in procession. The corpse could not have been any better & everything passed off nicely. Rec'd pay for same. Very nice day. Warm. Clear.

Wednesday, August 26

Working in shop etc. Wife & Charles out at Wm Caldwell's all day. Bought Cochen & 2 pullets (Buff Cochen) of Dr. Witmer, \$2.25 & sold 1 Cockerel & 2 pullets of Light Brahma for \$2.50, A.F.S. Warm & dry. Clear.

Thursday, August 27

Working at home all day picking off grapes & in shop. At Jr. OUAM in eve. Cool. Rain.

Friday, August 28

Working in shop & about home. Cool & pleasant. Partly cloudy.

Saturday, August 29

Working in shop. Rec'd word of the death of another of John Sourbeer's (Jr) children death, a.m. Went down & took charge of body. Funeral tomorrow at 1 & 2 o'clock. Made rough box & sent it to Green Hill U. B. Church & working at coffin. At IORM in eve. Made oven peal for Wm Keen. Cool in morning. Warm & dry. Ther: 43. Clear.

Sunday, August 30

Finished coffin & at Sunday school a.m. Attending funeral of another of John Sourbeer's (Jr) children. Lester Earle, aged 2+1+13. Buried at Green Hill U. B. Church. Rev. Saml Kauffman preached. Text: 2 Saml 12+23. Bearers: James McPherson, Wm May, Robert May, John Hess. 7 carriages. Preached after burial. (Dyptheria). Warm & very dusty. Clear.

Monday, August 31

Went to Lancaster. Was through the ice factory. It is certainly a great thing. Settled with S&S for paint to date. Also with A. B.

Rote & son. Bought 100 lb. bone meal at W. D. Sprecher & Son. Paid for same, \$12.25. Paid everything I bought today. Steinman, etc. Also Bartholomew for poplar. Pleasant. Light rain p.m. Partly clear.

Working in shop all day at small coffins. At IORM in eve. Had no meeting. Had a beautiful rain this p.m. & eve. Something that we so much needed. A. F. Martin & I saw something this eve. at Wm C. Smith Candy Shop that was certainly a disgrace. Such cursing & swearing & fighting. Standing back & allowing it. A man who professes Christianity to allow such conduct. I am certainly surprised. About 1

doz. boys & grown men using language to shocking to pen. Cool a.m., p.m., & eve. Cloudy.

Sunday, September 6

At teacher's meeting, Sunday school & Missionary meeting a.m. At preaching by Rev. Miller. Text: Luke 10+23-24. Rev. Gerhard was absent on account of sickness. At M. E. Church in eve. (Revived services). Rev. David Rhineer preached. Rained a.m. Pleasant p.m. Partly cloudy.

Monday, September 7

At Lancaster. Blanche was along. Got shoes, gums, etc., for her, things for shop, etc. The rain of Saturday & Sunday certainly freshened things in general. Pleasant all day. Clear.

Tuesday, September 8

Working in shop a.m. At P. C. Hiller's. Beach & Campbell were there & after some studying they paid the note & cash. I deducted the interest from April 1st to date of my own accord. Friday, September 11

Working in shop a.m. In shop & went out to East End School House to do papering but did not have the paper ready. Settled with W.C. Smith to date, owed him \$2.99 bal. & sold him feed sacks for same. This squares us to date. Amos Graver here in eve. Spoke to Smith about P.M. Bruner store bill he says he does not owe it (very wrong). Clear.

Saturday, September 12

A. F. Martin & I went to Rawlinsville to attend a meeting of the IOOF We paraded through the village & then to the camp meeting woods where the following addressed the large meeting: Rev. Went to Lancaster. Was sent for on account of death of Jacob Good's child over on old Mart Miller farm near Walnut Hill school. Went over & embalmed body. Died last night about 12 o'clock & I got there at 1 p.m. They

should have left me know sooner. Working in shop at coffin & rough box & took it to M. E. Cemetery, this place. Funeral on Friday at 12 & 2 o'clock. Warm all day & damp. Cloudy.
