Diary of Andrew J. Zercher 1916 Transcribed by Fred Schenck Feb. 2022

Saturday, January 1

Cloudy. About home all day. Holiday in city. At IORM in eve. Serving C of R for Mr. Hookey. Raining and very damp partly all day. The opening of another year. The desire of my heart is that I may live still a better life and by God's help, I will try to do so.

Sunday, January 2

Cloudy. At Sunday school and preaching by Rev Korn of Lancaster. A very plain, inspiring sermon. Text, Philippians 1-4. "For me to live in Christ". Took dinner with us. Blanche and Walter attended funeral of Fannie Shenk. Born February 15, 1838. Died December 30, 1915. Aged 77-10-15. Revs Abrm B. Herr and Jacob Thomas. Text, St. John 3-3. Bearers: Jacob Charles, Harry Sensenig, Valentine and Amos Shenk. Small funeral at River Corner Church. Very damp all day.

Monday, January 3

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. We are very busy with assessors work and will be for a month and a half at least.

Tuesday, January 4

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Called to John Schock's to take charge of body of wife. Blanche and Walter attended.

Wednesday, January 5

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Went by stage. Had call to come to the home of Alfred B. Herr. His mother died very unexpectedly of heart failure. Blanche and Walter attended. Pleasant all day.

Thursday, January 6

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Stayed at

Manhattan Hotel last night on account of inconvenience of getting to and from city (no stage). Cold raw wind all day.

Friday, January 7

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Blanche and Walter attended funeral of Mary M., wife of John Schock near Washington Boro. Born 12-17-1854. Died 1-4-1916. Aged 61-0-17. Rev Simon Musser opened the services and Rev Peter Williams (German), Rev Samuel Sharer. Text, Rev. 14 + 13, 14. Bearers: Benj Bricker, Henry Musser, Samuel Rosenberger and Michael Kauffman, members of York Brethren. Services at house only and internment in home cemetery. About 400 persons present. Cold raw air all day. Light snow last night.

Saturday, January 8

Partly clear. Ther: 12. At home. Down on farm and trimming grape vines partly all day. At IORM in eve. Blanche and Walter attended funeral of Annie E. Herr. Born 9-30-1838. Died 1-5-1916. Aged 77-3-5. Rev Speicher and Rev Miller. Bearers: Jacob Hershey, John Gehr, Benj Souder, Adam Miller, John Kendig, Oliver Manning. Large funeral at Evangelical Church, Creswell. Widow of Isaiah Herr. Pleasant but cold.

Sunday, January 9

Partly clear. Ther: 12. At Sunday school a.m. Had a call to come to Bowman's, Martic Twp., to take charge of the body of Charles Yackley who was found dead near there. Walter and John Z. Wade, Dept Coroner, went down and brought body here. Awaiting word from friends in Philadelphia. Harry and sister Lizzie Eberley came here this noon. Took dinner with us and spent some time and went over it to see Bro Emanuel who is sick in bed. They returned home this eve. At church in eve.

Rec'd word of death of Hebron Rankin's child. Cold all day.

Monday, January 10

Cloudy. At Lancaster all day. went in by stage. Walter took body of Yackley to Mr. rote's establishment. He will have charge of funeral and burial at Lancaster. I came home with Walter. Walter buried infant daughter, Mabel R., of Hebron Rankin this p.m. at River Corner Mennonite cemetery. At meeting of fire engine committee but nothing definite done. Will have another meeting next Monday eve. Raining and damp all day.

Tuesday, January 11

Cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Very damp and very much like spring.

Wednesday, January 12

Cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Our appeal days commenced today. Very busy. Went in and returned by stage. Very tiresome. Raining and very damp all day. Freezing in eve. Cold raw air all day.

Thursday, January 13

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Traveling by stage. Busy all day. Called to Chester Lanious to take charge of body of infant daughter. Living at foot of Red Hill, Martic Twp. Blanche and Walter attended. Rained partly all night and a.m. Roads very muddy. Very much colder this eve. Freezing.

Friday, January 14

Partly clear. Ther: 16. At Lancaster all day. (By stage). Busy all day. At U. E. Church in eve. They are having a series of meetings. Very cold all day and eve. Few flakes of snow.

Saturday, January 15

Partly cloudy. Ther: 10. Not at Lancaster. David Hallagar (Colored) died and I went and took charge of body. Blanche and Walter

away at the funeral of Hellen, infant daughter of Chester and Isabelle Lanious. Born June 8, 1915. Died January 13, 1916. Aged 7 months and 5 days. Rev Roberts spoke. Bearer: Walter Ressel. Funeral at Colemanville M. E. Church. Very few persons there. Rev Roberts' horse ran off. No one seriously hurt. Cold all day.

Sunday, January 16

Cloudy. At Sunday school and preaching a.m. Walter, Emma and Blanche went to Martin Funk's for dinner and spend the p.m. Fannie Mae Frey came to spend a few days with Blanche. Light snow last night. Moderated some in p.m. Colder and snow in eve.

Monday, January 17

Partly clear. Ther: 6. At Lancaster all day. Busy. At public meeting for purpose of organizing fire company. Pres: Frank Warfel. 1st V. P.: A.A. Onney. 2nd V.P.: Benj F. Smith, Jr. Re Secy: A.S. Benedict. Fin Secy: A.R. Caldwell. Treas: J.W. Morrison. Fire Chief: Elmer Hoak. 1st asst: Walter F. Ressel. 2nd asst: J.F. Murry. Trustees: John R. Good, 1 year. A.J. Zercher, 2 years. J.F. Murry, 3 years. Committee on by laws: A.J. Zercher, A.S. Benedict, John R. Good. Very cold and stormy.

Tuesday, January 18

Partly clear. Ther: 0. At Lancaster by stage. Busy all day. Blanche and Walter attended funeral of David Hallagar (Colored). Born 1873. Died January 15, 1916. Aged 78 years. Revs Roberts and Jacob Thomas. Rev. 4 chapt. Bearers: Saml Harnish, John Hess, Maynard and Harry Warfel. Small funeral at River Corner Mennonite Church. Coldest day of the winter.

Wednesday, January 19

Partly clear. Ther: 10. At Lancaster all day. Busy. Went to Quarryville on business and

then to Eberley's to stay all night. Cold raw wind.

Thursday, January 20

Cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Very busy. Was at H.N. Eberley's last night. Spent evening very pleasantly. Had a call to General Hospital, Lancaster, to bring body of Daniel B. Witmer to his home. Walter and John went in wagon. Moderated. Rain and sleet and thundered in p.m.

Friday, January 21

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day and had the Columbia appeals. Worked till 6 p.m. Great many appeals. Will stay at Manhattan Hotel tonight. Am real tired this eve. Regular spring weather. A change of 52 degrees from Tuesday.

Saturday, January 22

Cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Helped to audit the accounts of the Old Guard Fire and Storm Insurance Co. Bro Emanuel was to do it, but he being sick, I took his place and will give him the benefit. Spent last night at Manhattan Hotel. Have Blanche and Walter attended funeral of Daniel B. Witmer. Born Oct. 1, 1875. Died 1-19-1915. Aged 40-3-18. Rev Martin Groff. Text, Gen. 5-24. John Charles, 90 Psalms 12. Bearers: Landis, Ira, Willis Rice and Milton Kendig. Very large funeral at Stehman's Church, Manor. Quite warm. Rain and very muddy roads.

Sunday, January 23

Partly clear. At Sunday school a.m. At home and down at John's, p.m. At church in eve. Paul along and will stay all night with us. Rec'd word of death of infant of Harry Groff. Very pleasant day.

Monday, January 24

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Busy with

appeals. Walter buried stillborn for Harry Groff, Linestown, at Byerland. Beautiful day but bad roads.

Tuesday, January 25

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Busy with appeals. Beautiful day but the roads from Pike to this village are in a terrible condition. So deep with mud that they are almost too muddy to drive. A shame.

Wednesday, January 26

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Very busy all day. East Hempfield book in very bad condition. George Eckman moved out of the barber shop today. Some trouble between him and Amos Benedict who owns the building. He was asked to vacate. Light rain in a.m. Regular spring day. Quite warm. Roads still very, very bad.

Thursday, January 27

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Very busy all day. Worked in office till 9:45 p.m. Will stay at Manhattan Hotel tonight. Benj F. Smith, Jr., opened up barber shop where Geo Eckman had been. Beautiful day. Quite warm. Unseasonable weather.

Friday, January 28

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Busy all day. East Lampeter, Conestoga Twp. appeals day. Came home with Walter in auto. Very bad roads for auto especially. Beautiful day. Warm.

Saturday, January 29

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Busy all day with appeals. First Saturday for a long time that we were in the office in p.m. About home in eve. In and home via stage. A very pleasant change in the weather. Colder.

Sunday, January 30

Cloudy. At Sunday school and preaching a.m. At home p.m. Emma Warfel and Walter here

a while. At U. E. Church in eve, Blanche and I. Rain in a.m. (light). Damp p.m. and very damp and foggy in eve. and cool.

Monday, January 31

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Not so busy. No appeals for today. At fire company meeting this eve. Adopted by-laws and elected 9 directors for company. For 1 year, John R. Good, A.S. Benedict, A.F. Martin. 2 years, A.J. Zercher, Franklin Warfel, M.H. Groff. 3 years, J.F. Murry, J.W. Morrison, and M.G. Kneisley. Quite warm all day. Light rain in eve. Thermostat 43 at 6:35 a.m. 65 at noon. 58 at 6:30 in eve. Great weather for last day of January. One year ago we had a light snow.

Tuesday, February 1

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Rained partly all night and a.m. Damp p.m. Much colder in eve.

Wednesday, February 2

Cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Will stay in Lancaster tonight. Groundhog Day. He certainly did not see his shadow. Snowing partly all day and getting much colder.

Thursday, February 3

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Spent last night at the Manhattan Hotel very comfortably. Came home by stage this eve. Took us 2-1/2 hours. The roads are something fierce. Had 3 horses hitched to stage. From end of Pike very much more snow than I had thought. Partial eclipse of the sun could be seen very plainly from 10:30 to 11:15 a.m. Gust and Tony Vitalli were acquitted of murder in Chester County courts. Cold all day. Freezing all day.

Friday, February 4

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Staying at Manhattan Hotel tonight. Swope not in.

Went home sick yesterday p.m. John took tobacco away today brought 1/2 ton shif from Farmer's Assoc. at West Willow. Cold all day.

Saturday, February 5

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Busy in office a.m. Mr. Swope not in, he being sick in bed, his son reported. Came home by stage. Sold calf to Elmer Hoak on Thursday. Rec'd payment, \$6.56. Paid Biechler for making brooms, \$2.25. 15 in number. John M. Groff and John H. Myers appointed receivers for York Furnace Trolley Co. Cold and very icy on the streets this morning but moderated very much in p.m. Feels like snow this eve.

Sunday, February 6

Partly cloudy. At Sunday school a.m. At home and down at Oakwood's in p.m. At church in eve. Damp all day. Light rain in eve.

Monday, February 7

At Lancaster all day. Walter took me in this morning. Came home by stage. 1st ward city appeal day. Very few appeals. Quite warm a.m. and p.m. Very much colder in eve. Freezing.

Tuesday, February 8

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Will stay at Manhattan Hotel this eve. Rec'd word of death of Daniel H. Witmer on the Martin M. Brenneman farm, Manor. Blanche and Walter attended. Cold raw air all day.

Wednesday, February 9

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. At Manhattan Hotel last night. Had good bed and rested well. Rec'd check for tobacco delivered last week. (See Memoranda). Gave John Oakwood \$10.00 for special interest in caring for same as present. Cold damp air all day.

Thursday, February 10

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Rather cold all day. Blanche and Walter attended to the body of H.H. Rhinier's wife, Run Valley.

Friday, February 11

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Will stay at Manhattan Hotel tonight. Rec'd word of death of Jos Aston at County Alms house. Took body this p.m. to his son's home, Safe Harbor. Blanche and Walter attended funeral of Daniel H. Witmer. Born 6-27-1862. Died 2-8-1916. Aged 53-6-11. Revs Dr. Hess, Philadelphia and Martin Groff. Text, St. Luke 15-8. Bearers: Oliver, Chas, Horace, Ray and Elwood Earhart, John Ferry. Large funeral at Stehman's Church, Manor. Damp partly all day.

Saturday, February 12

Cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Came home with Blanche and Walter in auto. They were over at Rhinier's and put body in casket and then to Lancaster. At home in eve. Raining and very damp and colder p.m. and eve.

Sunday, February 13

Cloudy. At Sunday school and preaching a.m. At Home p.m. Blanche and Walter attended funeral of Susan J., wife of H.H. Rhinier, Run Valley. Born 1-20-1863. Died 2-10-1916. Aged 53 years and 20 days. Revs Zook and Noah Z. Hess spoke. Text, Romans 6-10. Bearers: John Wiggins, Oscar and Paul Cramer and Edw Hess (nephews). Large funeral at Marticville M. E. Church. A very unpleasant day. Rained last night. Everything covered with heavy coat of ice. Began snowing about 7 a.m. and a regular blizzard all day and getting colder and more storms in eve. Stopped snowing about 5:30 p.m.

Monday, February 14

Partly cloudy. Ther: 2 below zero. At Lancaster all day. Will stay at Manhattan

tonight. Blanche and Walter attended funeral of Joseph L. Aston. Born Aug. 24, 1830. Died Feb. 11, 1916. Aged 85-5-17. Rev Martin Groff. Text, Hebrew 12-1. Bearers: Raymond, Elwood and Clayton Aston, Jonas Frey. Very small funeral at Green Hill U. B. Church. Rec'd word of sudden death of John R. Smith, Baker, West Willow. Blanche and Walter attended. Was very much pleased and surprised to see Charles walk into office today. Very cold all day. Trees heavy with ice.

Tuesday, February 15

Partly clear. Ther: 0. At Lancaster all day. Was at Manhattan Hotel overnight. John Oakwood drove to Lancaster this morning and fetched Chas and Paul out home to spend the day, he not being to see us for over one year having working in St. Louis, Mo. Another birthday past (59). J.F. Murry had sale of personal property. Rec'd word of death of Amanda Mchaffey, formerly of this place. Cold all day. There is still a great deal of ice on trees, etc.

Wednesday, February 16

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day via stage both ways. Folks butchered at home. 2 hogs. Everything passed off nicely. I rubbed the hams and shoulders this eve (sugar cured). Blanche and Walter took casket to Smith's and put body in for tomorrow. J.Z. Peacock, a prominent business man of Lancaster, died very unexpectedly at Miami, Florida Tuesday eve. Pleasant day. Ice melting some, but still some on trees.

Thursday, February 17

Partly cloudy. Attending funeral of Amanda Mchaffey, a former citizen of this village. Rev Roberts. Text, Hebrew 9-27. Bearers: Benj and Christ Smith, Howard Duke, and myself. One of the smallest attended funerals I have

ever had. Had to stop men on street for bearers. Total number attending were 12 persons including relatives. Shame. Blanche and Walter attended funeral of John R. Smith. Born 5-10-1855. Died 2-14-1916. Aged 60-9-4. Rev Zook. Text, Gen. 3-9. Bishop Her. St. Matt 24-44. Bearers: Michael Yeagley, John Rohrer, Chas Yeagley, Edgar Reese, Herbert Goss, Chas Dagon. Very large attendance at Brick, Willow Street. Damp and warm p.m.

Friday, February 18

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day via stage. Sold 7 shoats to Fred B. Frey for \$24.00. Should have been \$25.00. Beautiful day. Snow going fast. Roads very sloppy. Getting much colder in eve.

Saturday, February 19

Partly clear. Ther: 7. At Lancaster all day. In office till noon. Very much colder and very high wind all day. Calm in eve.

Sunday, February 20

Cloudy. At Sunday school a.m. At home p.m. and preaching in eve. Blanche and Walter attended funeral of Annie Fenstermacher. Born 5-13-1851. Died 2-16-1916. Aged 64-9-3. Rev Noah Hess spoke at house of Elmer Kreider from where funeral was held. Rev Wiest. Text, 1 Cor 4-18. Bearers: Jacob Kline, John Markley, Elmer Kreider, Oscar Sangrey, Jacob Shank, Mr. Halloway. Services at Millersville U. E. Church. Internment Creswell. Damp raw air all day. Few flakes of snow occasionally.

Monday, February 21

Partly cloudy. Ther: 10. At Lancaster all day. Came home with Walter who had auto repaired at Lancaster. Very much colder.

Tuesday, February 22

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Very quiet

about office. Closed in p.m. Washington's birthday. Blanche attended wedding of Ruth (daughter of Conrad and Suie Hess) Hess. Married to John Hoffman, Maytown. Very pleasant day.

Wednesday, February 23

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Went to see picture "The Battle Cry of Peace". A wonderful production. Great. Esther Wade Harris was buried at M.E. Church this a.m. Damp and quite warm.

Thursday, February 24

Cloudy. At Lancaster all day. In by auto. Blanche along. Very damp all day. Foggy rain in eye, and colder.

Friday, February 25

Cloudy. At Lancaster all day via stage. Blanche and Walter called to take charge of body of Joseph Gerlach at home of son Harry. Damp all day and very much colder with snow and rain in eve.

Saturday, February 26

Partly clear. At home. Down on farm at Philip Mowerer's. Took after heifer and sold it to him for \$45.00 to be paid after April 1st. Paid J.W. Morrison bill to date by check, \$31.00. Paid W.K. Sangrey for services, 70 cents. Cold raw wind all day. Cold in eve. Ground covered with light coat of snow.

Sunday, February 27

Partly clear. At Sunday school and preaching a.m. Rev Shelley with us for dinner and spent part of p.m. At home in eve. Very stormy all last night and all day today and colder. Great groundhog weather.

Monday, February 28

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day via stage. Very stormy all day and cold.

Tuesday, February 29

Partly clear. Down on farm and out in orchard a.m. Met F.S. Harnish, one of our road supervisors, with regard to filling of vacancy on board and at sale of personal property of Mathias Gephard, p.m. At home in eve. Blanche and Walter attended funeral of Joseph Gerlach. Born 6-11-1834. Died 2-25-1916. Aged 81-8-14. Rev Hostetter and Bishop Light of Brethren Church preached. Text, Rev. 14-13. Bearers: Henry Herr, Jonas M. Winter, Benj H. Lefever and Daniel Neff. Funeral at Brethren Church, Manor. Cold but not near so stormy.

Wednesday, March 1

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Paid John Oakwood \$20.00 for February. Sold 3 pigs to A.H. Benedict for \$10.50, cash .John Bonholtzer and Bessie Eshleman were at the office this noon and I got their marriage license for them and paid it for friendship sake. Were married this p.m. by Rev H.G. Wagner, Smithville. They will go to their home at Pugh's Mill where they will reside. Very pleasant day. Colder in eve. Looks very much like snow.

Thursday, March 2

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Called to take charge of body of Catherine Kampel at Amos Keperling's near Squire Witmer's former home. Walter and Blanche attended. Cold in morning. Pleasant during day. Damp in eve. Snowed last night about 3/4 inch deep.

Friday, March 3

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. At fire demonstration in eve. We had our new chemical engine out. It worked fine. In 15 minutes after the alarm was given by ringing of IORM Hall bell they were playing on the fire and a success. Called to Highville to take

charge of body of George Manning, a former undertaker. Died very suddenly. They brought the body here to prepare for burial. Cold all day. Much colder in eve. and high winds.

Saturday, March 4

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. In office till noon. Paul and I took dinner and spent the p.m. together. He came along out in stage with me and spending the night with us. At home in eve. Cold morning. Cold wind all day.

Sunday, March 5

Partly clear. At Sunday school. Paul along, a.m. About home p.m. and at preaching in eve. Blanche and Walter attended funeral of Catherine Kampel. Born 7-28-1831. Died 3-2-1916. Aged 84-8-18. Rev Miller spoke at house. Rev Whitmore read scripture at church and Rev Gensler. Text Psalm 9+10. Bearers: Geo J. Fehl, Benj S. Myers, Jacob Lenhart and P.A. Urich. Funeral at Reformed Church, Millersville. Interment in adjoining cemetery. Cold high wind all day.

Monday, March 6

Cloudy. At home all day. Expected to attend funeral of Geo K. Manning but on account of weather and sprained my back this a.m. reloading caskets, did not. Walter and John took body of Geo K. Manning from here to Creswell Evangelical Church where funeral services were held. Born 11-6-1834. Died 3-3-1916. Aged 81-9-27. Rev H.E. Miller. Text, 39 Psalm 4. Bearers: John, Wm, Ezra and Cyrus Manning, nephews. Wife went to Lancaster for a few days stay. Commenced snowing this a.m. and snowed partly all day and cold. Therm about 22 all day.

Tuesday, March 7

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day via stage. Sold Rhoad's house, Safe Harbor, to Paul Williams of Cochranville, Chester Co. to be torn down and shipped. \$90.00. Very damp in morning. Beautiful day. Snow melting rapidly.

Wednesday, March 8

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Had auto repaired by Mr. Dombach. \$7.79. Came home by auto, wife and Miss Blanche Shue, who will spend some time with us. A friend of our family. Rain last night. Snow a.m. Beautiful p.m. Very much colder in eve.

Thursday, March 9

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day via stage. Sold calf to Elmer Hoak. \$8.03. Wife some better but not able to be out of bed. Cold raw wind all day.

Friday, March 10

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Walter and John down to Safe Harbor to take down small stable on the Boyd property and will bring it up here. Rather pleasant and very much colder and stormy in eve.

Saturday, March 11

Partly clear. At Lancaster a.m. Went to Gap, Mr. Swope and I, to visit our friend, Thos J. Marsh, formerly Deputy County Controller, who is blind and moving to Philadelphia. Found him well and looking fine. At home in eve. Sold brindle heifer to Frank Herr, Creswell. \$65.00. To deliver Monday or Tuesday. Cold raw wind all day. Cold in eve.

Sunday, March 12

Partly clear. At Sunday school and preaching a.m. At home and down at Oakwood's p.m. At home in eve. Mr. Baker, Blanche's friend, here for short stay. Called to Creswell to take charge of body of infant of Howard Snyder. Walter attended. Cold raw damp air all day.

Monday, March 13

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Blanche and

Walter attended funeral of Howard, infant son of Howard and Mary Snyder. Born Nov 4, 1915. Died March 12, 1916. Aged 4 months and 8 days. Rev Miller. Text, Solomon Song 6:2. Bearer: Walter Ressel. Funeral at Creswell U. E. cemetery. Services at house only. Delivered brindle heifer and calf to Frank Herr, Creswell. Paid for same. Beautiful day. Frost coming out. Roads very muddy.

Tuesday, March 14

Cloudy. At home and down on farm working and sold 4 shoats to John M. Henry for \$13.00. Went to Harry Frey's sale on Stehman farm. Very large and good sale. Bought stock bull for \$57.00, less 4% for cash, \$54.72. Will bring tomorrow and send check along. Cool and damp partly all day. Rain in eve.

Wednesday, March 15

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Snowing partly all day and colder. Very heavy roads.

Thursday, March 16

Partly cloudy. Ther: 8. At Lancaster all day. Paid Harry Jenkins for hauling and shredding fodder, \$25.00 in full to date. The groundhog season is closed and a failure as a weather prophet. Very cold all day.

Friday, March 17

Thursday, June 15

Cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Went by auto. Raining and very damp all day.

Friday, June 16

Cloudy. At Lancaster all day by trolley. Paid F.H. Sickman mill bill to date, \$4.80. (Will Beach driver). Rained partly all night and all day. Real heavy by times. Roads very muddy.

Partly clear. At home and down getting ready for sale a.m. At sale of personal property of Matilda Hollow's estate as administrator. Had a fair sale. Everything went along nicely. At home in eve. Damp a.m. Beautiful p.m. Warmer than we have had for at least two weeks.

Sunday, June 18

Corner. At community meeting at Highville U. B. Church. Dr. Asper Hess of Philadelphia gave a very good address. Enjoyed it very much. Walter, Emma, Blanche and I. Beautiful day. Warm.

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. The President (Wilson) ordered out (or made a call) for state militia to be ready to go to the Mexican border. Mexico has declared war on the U.S. Quite warm. Light rain in eve. Gust.

Tuesday, June 20

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day by trolley. Settled with Hallie Douts. Transferred certificate and settled in full. Did not charge her anything for what I did for her. Beautiful day.

Wednesday, June 21

Cloudy. Longest day. At Lancaster. Went with the commissioners to inspect bridges on the Pequea creek. We began at #3 bridge near Williamstown and worked downstream. Took in 12 bridges and took dinner at Foutz Hotel, Strasburg. Commenced raining and we went back to office. Mr. Magee had his car (Hudson). Mr. Magee, S.W. Diller, John R. Shenk, county engineer, F.H. Shaw and myself. Called to Irvin Shellenberger. Child died of scarlet fever. Walter and Blanche attended. Heavy rain and cool.

Thursday, June 22

Clear. At Lancaster all day. Stopped off at Millersville to see the parade. Preparatory holding a festival on Saturday eve. for the benefit of street lighting (electric). Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. John, Walter and Christ Urban at hay. Very pleasant day. Good hay day.

Thursday, June 29

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Wife and Andrew along to see circus parade. Andrew enjoyed it very much. Good hay weather. Warm all day.

Friday, June 30

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster by auto. Walter along and came home with auto. I came home by trolley this eve. Paid Walter his wages for June. \$30.00. Damp. Few drops of rain a.m. Very pleasant. Got some hay in, p.m. cool in eve.

Saturday, July 1

Clear. At Lancaster till noon. Went to D.B. Herr's sale, Rock Hill. Bought a few small articles, p.m. At home in eve. Paid John wages for June. \$20.00. Paid Lloyd \$4.00 for helping in hay making. Very warm all day.

Sunday, July 2

Partly clear. At Sunday school and preaching by a Mr. Landis of Lititz. A student at F & M College. A very good sermon. At home p.m. and eve. Appointed Walter S. Returned home via Millersville. Are very much pleased with it. Hope it is ok. Rec'd word to meet a body at Safe Harbor Monday morning at R.R. station and convey to Highville U. B. cemetery for interment. Beautiful day but cold raw air.

Sunday, December 3

Partly cloudy. Brought Dr. Krebs from trolley who preached for us a very good sermon and at Sunday school a.m. At home and took the Dr. To Benj Mylin's this p.m. He is to preach at Willow Street this eve. Dr. Krebs, Mary and Clara Kreider and Ruth Zercher took dinner with us. Cold damp air all day. Rain in eve.

Monday, December 4

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Blanche and Walter attended funeral of Elizabeth G., wife of Wm T. Gainer. Born 7-7-1844. Died 11-30-1916. Aged 72-4-23. Rev Howell. Text, Rev. 14-13. Bearers: Aaron Rineer, Henry Rice, Levi Warfel, Chas Rhoads, Fitzline Neil, Aldus Erb. Large funeral at Colemanville. Also met train at Safe Harbor and took body of Mrs. Hissler, to Highville U. B. Church and interned in cemetery. Burial service only. Damp raw air all day. Light rain last night.

Tuesday, December 5

Partly clear. Ther: 70. Butchered 2 hogs this a.m. My first helping for some time. Down on farm Harry Eckman and I. We took down the wire fence along road from the lane to the ore mine lane and will not have any fence there. Maud Graver, daughter of M.M. Graver, and wife was married today. Light rain in morning. Most beautiful day in part of a.m. and all of p.m. Regular summer day.

Wednesday, December 6

Clear. At Lancaster all day. Blanche along. Rec'd word this p.m. of the death of Mrs. Frank Miller, Marticville. Blanche and Walter took charge. Walter butchered his 2 hogs today. Great change in the weather. Cold and very high wind all day.

Thursday, December 7

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Blanche and Walter attended funeral of Walter David, infant son of Walter and Martha Glick Herr. Born 7-15-1916. Died 12-4-1916. Aged 4 months and 19 days. Rev Martin Groff. Text, Job 14-14. Rev Saml G. Kauffman spoke. Bearers: John and Oscar Sneath, Benj and Harry Eshleman. Large funeral at Stehman's U. B. Church. Cold raw air all day.

Tuesday, December 12

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Busy all day. Went in by auto. Had hard traveling coming home on account of snow. Snowing partly all day. Had snowed last night about 6 inches deep. Colder.

Wednesday, December 13

Partly clear. At Lancaster by auto. Wife along. Roads very much better. Busy in office. Beautiful winter day. Storm arose in eve. and had a regular blizzard. Snowing very fine.

Thursday, December 14

At Lancaster all day. Went by auto. Had quite a time getting in. Roads drifted quite a good deal. Went through drifts 2 feet deep. Stuck several times. Roads very much better in eve. Cold raw wind all day.

Friday, December 15

Cloudy. Working about home a.m. At sale of Eli Warfel's personal Property p.m. Bought 2 rolls of wire fencing, \$4.25, paid and paid Fred H. Sickman \$25.00 hay on ore mine farm and balance of straw, then at home in eve. Snowing partly all day. The heaviest snow for some years so early in season. Fully 10 inches of snow fell since early this morning. Beautiful snow. No wind and not very cold. Clear in eye.

Saturday, December 16

Partly clear. Working about home all day. Filed saws, shoveling snow, etc. Sold sleigh to John Z. Wade. Had him repair radiator for Saxon auto. Blanche, Walter's wife and Andrew went to Lancaster this morning. Paid Jacob Ressel to date, \$7.75. Commenced drifting. Blowing very hard at noon. Roads closed at places. Must take to fields. Snow fully 12 inches deep. The coldest day of the season. Therm not above 14 degrees any time today.

Sunday, December 17

Partly clear. Ther: 7. At Sunday school and practicing Christmas services a.m. At home p.m. and eve. Very cold. Moderating in p.m. Coldest morning. Plenty of sleighs running today.

Monday, December 18

Partly cloudy. Ther: 0. At Lancaster all day. Went down to Eberley's this eve to see Mother and stay all night. Snowing p.m. and very cold all day. Therm 6 below at places in county.

Tuesday, December 19

Partly clear. Ther: 10. At Lancaster all day. Spent a very pleasant evening last night at Eberley's. Found all well. Cold all day. Roads closed at quite a few places with snow drifts.

Wednesday, December 20

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Went by trolley. Cold and rather damp. Looks very much like more snow.

Thursday, December 21

Cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Busy getting assessors books ready. Went in by sleigh. Came home by trolley. Paid Howard Duke 75 cents balance due for orchard work. Light rain last night. Very damp and sloppy all day. Moderated very much since yesterday.

Friday, December 22

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Rain last night and a.m. Snow melting fast. Clearing p.m. and very much colder and very high wind blowing. A regular gale. Phones out of service.

Saturday, December 23

Partly clear. At Lancaster till 2:30 p.m. At home balance of day. At IORM in eve. Acting as C of R for B.F. Hookey, he going to spend the holidays with his daughter, Mrs. H.M. Herbert. Cold all day.

Sunday, December 24

Partly clear. At Sunday school. Treated school to 1 lb. chocolates and orange and practiced Christmas service for tomorrow eve., a.m. At home p.m. and eve. Pleasant day. Cold. Look very much for snow.

Monday December 25

Partly clear. At home all day. Spent a very pleasant Xmas. God was very kind to us this past year. Had our Xmas service at Reformed Church. The children did their part very well

and a large attendance. Cold raw air all day. Ideal Xmas weather. Sleighing very good.

Tuesday, December 26

Partly clear. At Lancaster till 3 p.m. I came home so early on account of poor trolley service on Pequea road. Beautiful winter day.

Wednesday, December 27

Cloudy. At Lancaster all day. Busy all day. Rec'd word this eve. to come to Henry Harnish, Long Lane, to take charge of body of Elizabeth Buckwalter. Blanche and Walter attended. Mrs. Caroline Bruner of Columbia, H.F. Bruner's widow, died today. Damp and raining partly all day. Moderating.

Thursday, December 28

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster all day Moderated. Rained last night and a.m.

Friday, December 29

Partly clear. At Lancaster all day. Rec'd word this p.m. of the death of Cyrus Gontner, Highville. Walter and Blanche attended. Cold all day but beautiful winter weather.

Saturday, December 30

Partly cloudy. At Lancaster. Wife along. She went to Columbia to funeral of her aunt, Mrs. H.F. Bruner. At IORM in eve. Served as C of R for B.F. Hookey. Elizabeth G. Buckwalter. Born 11-7-1848. Died 12-27-1916. Aged 68-1-27. Revs Abrm Herr and Jacob Thomas. Bearers: Harry, Isaac and John Harnish and John Warfel. Small funeral at Mennonite Church, River Corner. Cold raw air all day. Snow squalls about noon.

Sunday, December 31

Partly clear. At Sunday school and preaching a.m. by our newly elected pastor, Rev Geo Stauffer. His wife being with him, they took dinner with us and spent part of p.m. At home in eve. Beautiful winter day. Cold.
